The weather is getting quite cold but as you can see from the table, it is very important for students to attend school every day and on time. Please remember that we have heating in all three Learning Neighbourhoods.

We often have students arriving late to school. Students arriving late at school causes major disruptions to students' learning and they miss key learnings as Math is the first subject of each day.

We can all play a role in ensuring students attend school each day and on time.

Story Hubs

This year, our school is fortunate to commence our partnership with 100 Story Building. This three-year partnership will support our work in writing by increasing engagement and creativity. Story Hubs is a school and community program aimed at developing curious, confident and engaged learners.



Story Hubs are working with us to develop a unique

co-designed Story Hub - a wondrous and imaginative new space built within the school, providing an opportunity for students and teachers to step outside the boundaries of their classrooms. In their Story Hub, students will collaborate and take creative risks in their learning and teachers will use the space as a tool to transform their practice and support creativity.

During our Curriculum Day on **Wednesday 28th May**, staff had a very engaging day with the Story Hubs presenters, Simon and Brendon. Staff spent time unpacking and exploring the Sparking Creativity student workshops as well as unpacking the Story Hubs programming principles.

School Saving Bonus

The Victorian Government delivered the School Saving Bonus (SSB) – a one-off support of \$400 for eligible government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025. The SSB can be used for uniforms and textbooks/activities until Monday 30 June 2025.

This must be done through the online system, prior to June 30, 2025. We encourage our families with any remaining unallocated SSB funds to be allocated towards school activities to ensure funds are carried forward in July 2025.

Any funds remaining after 30 June 2025, including online voucher amounts that have not been redeemed, will become a credit to use on school activities. However, the credit will not be available on your family account at our school until late July. To use any remaining SSB funds to cover the cost of school activities in July, please refer to the SSB online system and allocate the funds to school activities before 30 June 2025.

Parent / Teacher Interviews

Parent /Teacher Interviews will be held on **Wednesday 2nd July** from 12:00pm-6:00pm. Students will be required to be collected from school at **11:30am** to allow for parent /teacher interviews to commence.

A note about the Parent/Teacher interviews will be sent home soon.

Parent / Teacher Interviews are a wonderful opportunity to meet those teachers who are working with your child every day at school. I know the teachers look forward to meeting families and discussing your child's progress at school. We hope you find it useful to clarify any issues or questions you might have about your child's learning.



National Simultaneous Storytime 2025

On **Wednesday, 21 May 2025**, students and staff at Broadmeadows Valley Primary School united with children across Australia for the 25th annual National Simultaneous Storytime, celebrating the joy of reading together. This year's featured book was *The Truck Cat* by Deborah Frenkel and illustrated by Danny Snell—a heartwarming tale about Tinka, a cat who travels the country with his human companion, Yacoub, exploring themes of belonging, home, and friendship.



At exactly 12:00 PM, our classrooms paused to read the story aloud, creating a shared moment of literacy and connection with over two million participants nationwide. Following the reading, students engaged in enriching activities inspired by the book, such as crafting their own "truck cats," mapping Tinka's journey across Australia, and writing poems.



National Simultaneous Storytime is an initiative by the Australian Library and Information Association (ALIA) that promotes the value of reading and literacy through a shared reading experience. We're proud to have been part of this meaningful event and look forward to continuing to foster a love of reading in our school community.
