## **Remembrance Day**

Coming up on **Tuesday November 11th** is Remembrance Day – Remembrance Day is one of the most important days on our commemorative calendar. It's a day when we acknowledge those who died or suffered while serving in wars, conflicts and peace operations. Remembrance Day is held on 11 November each year.



This is the anniversary of the <u>Armistice of 1918</u> that ended fighting in World War I. The war didn't officially end until 28 June 1919 with the <u>Treaty of Versailles</u>. People in Australia and many other countries observe one minute's silence at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month because that's when the Armistice came into effect. It's a time to honour all personnel who died or suffered in the service of Australia. the day many countries around the world remember those who have sacrificed their lives for their country in war.

The poppy flower is the symbol of Remembrance Day and to support the RSL we are selling \$1 pins, \$2 and \$5 poppies, \$3 wrist bands, \$4 bag tags and \$5 pens at the office over the next two weeks.

To be eligible, you must:

- √ Have a Health Care or Pension Concession Card
- √ Have a child in a primary school we work with
- √ Support your child to attend school regularly

#### What else do I need to know?

Learning for Life is a partnership between your family and The Smith Family.

As a parent, guardian, or caregiver, you need to commit to:

- Regular school attendance
- Completing a yearly update for each child
- Providing a school report yearly for each child
- Maintaining contact with The Smith Family
